What's Happening at Central?

Another slow, hot and humid month in the life of the church but we do have events to celebrate. We just learned that Pastor Sonna has been approved to attend a four day assessment program at Columbia Seminary in Georgia in November. This is part of her training to become a 1001 New Worshipping Communities leader. Pastor Steven will also be attending but he will not be assessed. The Presbytery of AR will be paying the expenses.

CSA (Community School of the Arts) has moved in and will begin classes in August. They have really cleaned up the area, waxing floors, cleaning and painting walls. The space allows them to expand their program of providing high-quality instruction in music, theatre, dance, and visual art.

Seekers (Monday Morning Bible Study) will be resuming after Labor Day with video series called ProFuture Faith. The Enneagram groups have resumed meeting and other program and activities suspended for the summer are gearing up.

The Session voted to grant Blake Bulger and Sydney Oliver scholarships of \$3000 for this school year. The amount of the scholarship will be determined by the Session annually depending on the growth of the fund. Only the income can be spent. Blake and Sydney made a 4.0 and a 3.5 GPA, respectively. We are very proud of our young adults.

The Kathya Covenant Group will be placing an information display in the hallway leading to the After Worship Fellowship the first Sunday of each month to keep the congregation aware of her situation and offer a chance to make donations. The auction of the CDC contents will be held September 10th in and around the CDC building. The proceeds will be placed into her fund for monthly distributions. We are currently sending her \$200 per month. \$100 comes from the Needy Fund and has been approved by the Session for a period until October 2022 (three additional years and \$100 comes from The Kathya Davilia Fund.

The New Vision Home is very busy. In July, 108 children entered the home, either coming into the Foster Care Program or attending family meetings and other functions. The house is in need of trash bags, paper towels, and toilet paper. Any help would be appreciated. Place your items in the box outside of the Sanctuary.

Financially, we are on course with the pledges but we still have huge repairs that have to be addressed. It is part of the function of the Future of the Church Committee at this time to gather those costs and determine how we can meet the needs of the church spiritually, physically and financially.

At this time she is facing surgery to remove a large non-malignant growth from her breast. Both of these incidents affect Kathya in different ways, but the financial affect is large. Our support group intends to do a better job of keeping the congregation informed of Kathya's changing condition. We also intend to make it easier for the congregation to make on going contributions to help Kathya and her sons. From now on, there will be updates in the Spire about this family and a member of our group will be collecting offerings every first Sunday of the month after Worship. Please consider caring for Kathya with your prayers and your contributions.
